## A True Community of Music

Our return to in-person music-making wouldn't be complete without bringing the outside community back into the fold.

The Musical Storytelling Program for young children and their caregivers ran successfully on-site for three performances at area libraries and elementary schools. Our faculty musicians also gave three modified virtual performances in collaboration with Belmont Public Library to ensure that families venturing more slowly to in-person activities were still able to participate.

We were also thrilled to run sessions of Watch City Singers and Golden Roots, our creative aging programs for older adult visitors to the Waltham Council on Aging and Grove Hall Community Center in Dorchester.

## **Together At Last**

The true "power" in Powers' community of friends, supporters, and families this past year was the ability to work together to bring back in-person learning. You - and we - value the experience of playing together so highly that we had to make it happen.

During the 2021-2022 year, Powers welcomed 135 young children back to early childhood classes, 73 Belmont public school students into Saturday Morning School, 61 musicians into our orchestra and ensemble programs, and hundreds of private lesson students back to the studios they call their second homes.

## **A Flourishing Summer**

Though there was some uncertainty about how the summer would play out, Powers was ready to open enrollment for all five of our summer day programs on January 2nd. We made the decision to hold everything in-person with careful plans for health considerations, and our preparedness paid off!

We were truly fortunate to see 178 enrollments for summer day programs - a 35% increase from the summer of 2021!

This was a testament to the joy and inspiration of playing and learning together that we try to uphold in everything we do.

## **Powers Stayed Strong**

Through this past year, the Powers community really came together to keep students playing, smiling, learning, and growing as a music family.

By the end of June, revenue was 13% ahead of where we were at the start of Summer 2021, and just 4% behind pre-pandemic revenue.

We couldn't have achieved this level of stability without the unending support of our donors, benefactors, parents, faculty, board, and friends.




## Total Unique Students in FY22: **963**

## Because of You...


The Powers community raised more than \$95,000 in annual fund income this year! The fall "Shape the Year' campaign alone raised \$53,468 (a 57% increase over fall 2020), providing 71% of our contributed income for the year.

These funds were used specifically to set Powers up for success for both the short-term and long-term. We upgraded equipment to easily provide both in-person and remote lesson options, we increased our livestreaming capabilities to share music with others, and we increased our financial aid scholarships - all to bring music to as many people as we possibly could in the way that worked best for them.

This support truly gave us the solid foundation we needed to keep the Powers community thriving and ready for anything that came our way.

## The 2021-2022 year was a successful one for revenue, enrollments, and fundraising. You helped us weather the storm - now we look ahead to a bright, exciting future.
